

Declaration of Conformity

Directive (EU) 2015/863 of 31 March 2015 amending Annex II to Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the list of restricted substances.

EC directive 2002/95/EC restricts the use of the hazardous substances listed below in electrical and electronic equipment. IPT Ltd has taken reasonable action to establish that the products we manufacture, namely:

Passive single and 3phs Power distribution units Managed single and 3phs Power distribution units Cable assemblies.

Are free from these substances, or in extreme cases, that the levels of these substances in these products do not exceed the permitted level and thus meets the requirements of the directive.

The substances and their permitted concentration levels are listed as follows.

Lead 0.1%
Mercury 0.1%
Hexavalent Chromium 0.1%
Polybrominated Bippenyls 0.1%
Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers 0.1%
Cadmium 0.01%

On March 31, 2015, Directive 2015/863 added four additional substances to RoHS 2. The restriction on use of these substances will go into effect on July 22, 2019 as RoHS 3. These additional substances and their permitted limits are shown below.

Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) Phthalate 1000ppm
Benzyl Butyl phthalate 1000ppm
Dibutyl Phthalate 1000ppm
Diisobutyl Phthlate 1000ppm
